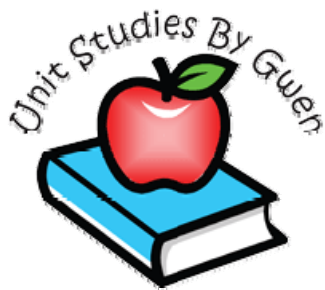

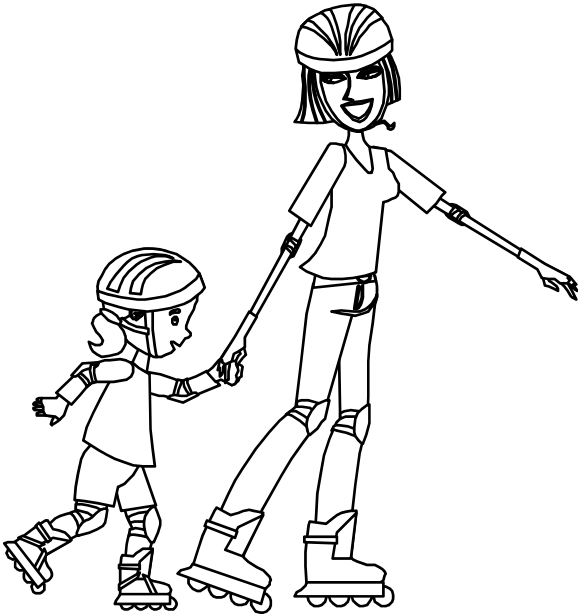
What are some things you can do to people that are mean to you that would make God happy?

You want them to be nice to you. So, God tell them.



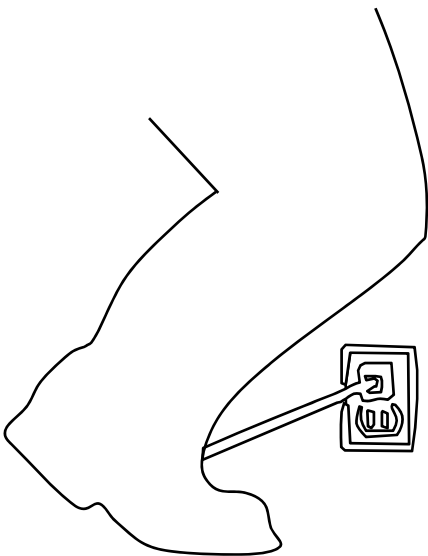
